

Judge Shira Scheindlin to Keynote IE Discovery's Third Annual Electronic Discovery Symposium for Government Agencies

Jason Baron, Director of Litigation, National Archives; Joan Fina, Office of General Counsel, Federal Trade Commission; David Gaston, Office of General Counsel, Department of Agriculture; Maura R. Grossman, Counsel, Wachell, Lipton, Rosen & Katz; and Miriam Nisbet, Director, Office of Government Information Services, National Archives and Records Administration are also speaking.
